

## Strong Active Terms (SAT) Workout

The following sentences provide context clues to the meaning of words that appear in the January 2007 issue of Writing. Use them to help you select the correct definition.

**Example:**

I understand your **quandary**—as an animal lover, you don't want to dissect a frog. However, dissecting an avocado is not a logical substitute.

Ⓐ excitement Ⓑ dilemma Ⓒ nervousness Ⓓ joy

The correct answer is Ⓑ dilemma. Why? Notice how the context clues *don't want to dissect a frog* and *however* tell you that *quandary* has a negative connotation. It is not a positive word. If you're still not sure of the answer, try plugging in each of the answer choices to see what fits.
