

**Do You Agree? – ANSWER KEY**

*For a sentence to make sense, the subject and the verb must agree. Read the sentences below. Do the subject and verb agree? If the sentence is wrong, write the sentence so that the subject and verb agree. If the subject and verb already agree, write “correct” on the line.*

1. Jamie or Carl are the best student in the class.

**Jamie or Carl *is* the best student in the class.**

2. There’s a lot of movies I want to see.

**There *are* a lot of movies I want to see.**

3. Those books on the floor belongs to Mike.

**Those books on the floor *belong* to Mike.**

4. My brother, or my friends, are going out for dinner.

**My brother, or my friends, *is* going out for dinner.**

5. The athletes and the coach is taking a bus to the game.

**The athletes and the coach *are* taking the bus to the game.**

8. The movie, starring Johnny Depp, Orlando Bloom, and Keira Knightly, are coming out in May.

**The movie, starring Johnny Depp, Orlando Bloom, and Keira Knightly, *is* coming out in May.**

9. One of the cats start purring when I walk into the room.

**One of the cats *starts* purring whenever I walk into the room.**

10. All of them, including Adam, is coming.

**All of them, including Adam, *are* coming.**

11. Everyone in the class is going on the trip.

**Correct**

12. If Judy and her loud friends keeps talking, I won’t be able to hear what’s going on.

**If Judy and her loud friends *keep* talking, I won’t be able to hear what’s going on.**
